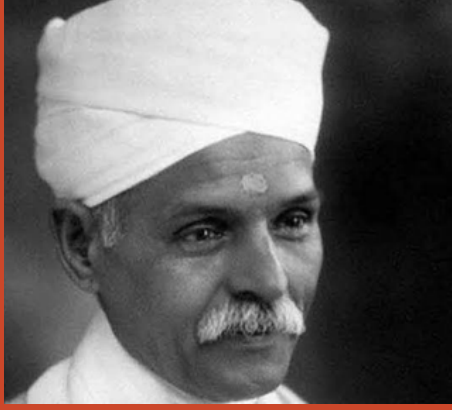

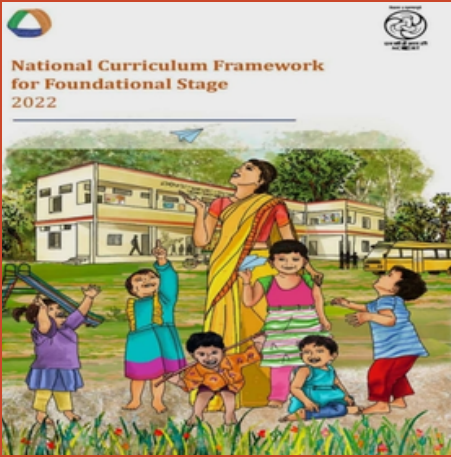

National Maths-Science Fair Organized in Bhopal

Bhopal | National Maths-Science Fair was organized from November 3rd to 6th at Saraswati Vidya Mandir Higher Secondary Awasiya Vidyalaya, Bhopal. All 11 kshetras were represented in the fair. 405 students and 16 teachers participated in this event in 10 different competitions. The participants were divided into Bal, Kishore, Tarun and Acharya Varg. 137 teachers from 30 educational institutions in Bhopal were present as judges in various competitions for all four categories. There are 13 schools affiliated with Vidya Bharati, 9 peer-reviewed schools and 9 CBSE schools. About 1600 students and teachers of the schools visited the fair.

The fair was inaugurated by Madhya Pradesh's Science and Technology Minister Omprakash Saklecha, Director General of the State Council of Science and Technology Dr. Anil Kothari and Vidya Bharati Akhil Bharatiya Sah-Sangathan Mantri Shriram AAaravkar. He said that sports help in the physical and mental development of the students; a healthy mind is formed in a healthy body and if the mind is healthy then the character too. 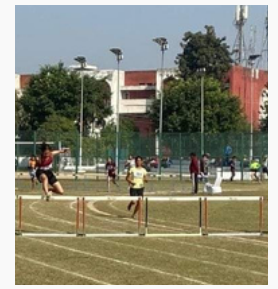

address that Mahila Samanvay and promotion are in charge in 24 prants. This year 350 areas have to move forward. The program has to be done with the nation first.

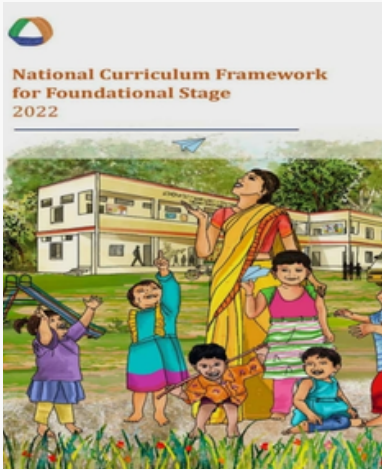

National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage-2022

Vidya Bharati welcomes the launching of the National Curriculum Framework for the foundation stage, which is the crucial stage, but also challenging and base for all other stages. It is definitely transformative as it is thinking of holistic development of the child along with building competencies and a value base. This curriculum framework promotes the medium of instruction at the foundation stage in the home language, which is path-breaking and more scientific. To ensure local relevance and to keep alive a rich range of Bharatiya diverse and vibrant ECCE traditions developed over millennia, it is suggested that these are

to be appropriately incorporated into the curricular and pedagogical framework of ECCE, for enjoyment, excitement, local culture, a sense of Identity and community.

Learning by doing: Activities planned with illustration for developing regard for the natural environment, mathematical understanding and abilities to recognize the world through quantities, shapes and measures, develop effective communication skills for day-to-day in two languages and ultimately acquiring fluency in reading and writing is very much scientific and experiential learning. Principle to practice & Practice to principles:

For teachers, it is a very good guide as some of the principles are derived. Detailed useful information is given to teachers for classroom management and the learning process.

Guidance for technology usage: Audio will enhance listening skills and aid in language acquisition. It is also suggested to have technology-based Teaching Learning Material. Really encouragement for digital infotainment for children is suggested. Evidence suggests moderate & controlled use of digital technology can be very much beneficial to children's mental well-being. Teacher empowerment and upskilling is a big challenges that is to be judiciously planned.

Greatest Convocation Speech by Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya 14 December, 1929



Kashi Hindu University started its work in October 1917. The convocation speech given by Mahamana Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya on the occasion of the twelfth degree - distribution ceremony of the university (14 December

1929 AD) is like a guiding book for the entire education world. Bharat's ancient Gurukul-based education system and the Bharatiya system with the European education system prevalent in that period are very different. In this lecture, Mahamana expresses his views on the medium of education, the importance of Sanskrit education, education of science - art - skill - business - technology, women's education, employment-oriented education, etc. everything related to the practical side of social life. Underlining the need for education for nation-building, he considers physical education, character-building and patriotic education to be essential.

Mahamana begins this speech by describing the objectives and ideals of the establishment of the university. He also seeks to combine the latest advances in art, science, and craft with the imitation of the best culture through the revival of the highest system of the ancient schools of Takshila and Nalanda. At the time of the establishment of the university, the four main goals were -

1. Propagation of the best elements of Bharatiya culture in general through the study of the Sanskrit language and scriptures.
2. All-round education and research in arts and sciences.
3. Increase of knowledge related to craft, art skills, and business for the progress of industries in Bharat.
4. To inspire virtue and character-building among the youth through the education of religion and ethics.

Malviya Ji considers the Sanskrit language to be the most valuable in the ancestral traditions of Bharat because the best philosophy and literature of Bharat have been written in this language. He believes that "How every human being can make his personal, physical, mental, spiritual and character progress and how he can organize himself into a powerful society, its complete interpretation is found in this language.

From the point of view of the excellence of language, the connoisseurs of language have given Sanskrit first place among all the languages of the world.

Mahamana Kashi Hindu University is called 'Navin Rashtriya Vidya Mandir'. That is why he talks about 'protecting the unbreakable spiritual traditions of Bharat that have been going on for centuries and making beautiful use of the tradition-fed national treasure with a beautiful combination of the ancient and the present. With an education in the Sanskrit language, he wants to advance his students not only in philosophy and spirituality but also in the fields of mathematics, astrology, Ayurveda, and Literature.

Medium Of Education:

Mahamana considers his mother tongue only as the medium of education. Let us note that this speech is from the year 1929 when Bharat was ruled by the British and the path of progress for Bharatiya was through English, on the contrary, Mahamana expresses concern that the use of English in the education sector is becoming widespread. Due to this, Bharatiya languages are being forgotten.

Mahamana is proud that Kashi Hindu University has completed M.A. in Hindi which is recognized as a subject for a degree and here a group of scholars is composing textbooks of arts, science, and medical subjects in Hindi.

Arts and Sciences: Education and Research

Malviya Ji was in favor of public education of arts, science, and research on new dimensions. It is surprising and enjoyable for us people associated with the education sector that even in 1929 AD when the education sector was not very developed in the country, Kashi Hindu University started M.A. and M.Sc. Humanities subjects like ancient Bharatiya history and culture, sociology, philosophy and psychology, economics, political science, etc. up to class 12; The syllabus was prepared for the teaching of languages like Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Arabic, Persian, Urdu, Marathi, Bangla, etc. and branches of science like Mathematics, Astrology, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Biology, and Geology. Not only for teaching but for the work of experiment and investigation-research, there was also a system of systematic libraries and laboratories in the university. Intending to prepare the next generation of capable teachers, the arrangement of a teacher training center in the university indicates the vision of Malviya Ji.

Along with this, there is also a law college, so that there is a proper arrangement of education for the students who want to go into the field of advocacy. Ayurveda college of Kashi Hindu University was also functional before the year 1929.

Woman Education

Malviya Ji considered the proper system of women's education essential for the balanced development of society. He talks about it even in this convocation address. In 1929 AD, when education for women in general Bharatiya society was rare in Bharat, a women's school had been started in Kashi Hindu University with a separate hostel with accommodation for one hundred girl students, whose manager and F.A. (Senior Secondary) were four female teachers for teaching girl students up to Senior Secondary level. Graduate and Postgraduate girls could now get an education in all subjects. Malviya Ji not only gave lectures in favor of women's education but also created a proper system, he presents an ideal before society.

Arts-Skills and Vocational Education

Employment-oriented education, education that gives one the ability to stand on one's own feet, art-skills and industry-business education, and vocational education, have become topics of discussion and contemplation among educationists, governments, and policy-makers far and wide. But about a century ago, Mahamana started an engineering college. Malviya Ji always talks about vocational education to enable the students to lead a self-respecting self-reliant life after completing their education, but his idea is related to the personal life of the students as well as the life of the nation. In this convocation lecture, he says, "Such education related to science, art skills, and business should be given to the students along with practical knowledge, which will lead to the progress of industry-business and domestic business in the country."

This shows Malviyaji's foresight and thinking ahead of time. Kashi Hindu University not only had branches of mechanical-electrical engineering but metallurgy and

industrial chemistry departments had also been established, which were not started in higher education institutions of many countries of the world till then. Malviya Ji feels proud that the facility for these subjects is not available in any other university in Bharat, but Kashi Hindu University has taken the initiative. He also expresses happiness over the rigorous selection process of students, high academic quality, and high results.

He mentions that the education of applied science should not remain only bookish. For this, students of engineering colleges are sent every year for a fixed period to railways, factories, and mines to see the work being done and learn by doing direct work. As a result of this, the students who have gone into social life after getting degrees from this engineering college, get easily employed in power generation, railways, and mining-related industries because of their practical skills.

Do remember that this was only the third decade of the last century.

Till then Bharat neither had railway lines across the country nor did it have a large number of industries involved in power generation, distribution, and manufacturing of electrical equipment. But keeping in view the future of Bharat, Malviya Ji gave place to these subjects of engineering and their application skills in the curriculum of Kashi Hindu University. Similarly, regarding the education of industrial and commercial chemistry, Malviya Ji says that this department is preparing such youths who can start their small-scale industries instead of looking for jobs for employment. Where self-employment will get a boost from this, the other direction of Mahamana's social thinking will also be strengthened, that is, domestic industries and businesses will develop. In the youth, the habit of earning livelihood through one's hard work will be formed, loyalty towards labor will increase, and self-respect will rise.

In the convocation speech, Mahamana says, "The question of poverty and unemployment is becoming complicated. It is necessary to solve this. In my understanding, this problem can be solved to a large extent if the youth are given vocational and practical science education. They should not succumb to the mirage of high-paying government jobs or to professions that are already overcrowded." Malviya Ji suggests the full dimension of self-reliance and employment-oriented education is being considered as 'government jobs' today.

Malviya Ji also links this with the self-reliance of Bharat's economy.

He further says, "In this way, we will be able to gradually reduce the import of foreign goods to some extent and also stop our raw material going out of the country. Ten thousand Bharatiyas can be given employment every year by getting a little help from the government for the growth of the national business through proper education in this field. This is the dream of Malviyaji to make Bharat's economy self-sufficient. For this, they underline the need to increase cooperation between the government and universities.

Mahamana says, "The fourth aim of the university is to build the character of the students by considering religion and ethics as an essential part of education.

We consider religion as the direct path to character building and the true door to worldly happiness. We consider patriotism as the best power, which leads a man to do selfless service of a high order. Today, where there are disputes regarding the interpretation of religion in social life, one religious faith is said to be superior or lesser than any other faith, these lofty thoughts of Mahamana are guiding principles of education. Malviya Ji considers it necessary to narrate religious-mythological narratives, ethical stories, and life events of great men to the students for the education of character building so that a sense of reverence for their nation and life values can be created in them.

Malviya Ji does not satisfy only with religious education for morality and character building. He considers subjects and programs related to physical exercise, sports, literature, and culture essential for the complete character formation of the youth. He says that out of 2600 students studying at Kashi Hindu University at that time, 1600 students lived in

hostels. The residences of the teachers are also in the hostel itself. The arrangement has been made in such a way that the teachers and the students keep in contact with each other and make efforts for progress. This is an innovative experiment of Malviya Ji to teach life through symbiosis. He explains its usefulness to the present community, "Students themselves have established their own social and literary gatherings, drama circles and sports committees and the State Council of the University. In this parliament, they have the full right to debate on all kinds of political, social, and education-related subjects. They organize various games, choose their captains and keep their accounts. Some of the students are members of the Military Education Corps of the university, where they are given the best military education. The atmosphere is pure and prosperous. Apart from receiving education from gurus, each student is his guru and also teaches his classmates. The sense of self-esteem is thus increasing among the students which augurs well for the future.

This view of Malviya Ji clarifies that for all-around personality development, only the curriculum of bookish education is not sufficient, but only a balanced combination of various aspects of life gives the youth the direction of life. That's why they consider industrial-vocational education, character-building education, physical education, military education, and literary-cultural activities as indispensable parts of education, and for all these, they have made proper arrangements at Kashi Hindu University.

Cuttack | The 14th National Seminar on National Education Policy 2020 and Comprehensive Assessment for Student Development was organized on 20-21 November 2022 at Saraswati Vidya Mandir, GatiROUTPATNA, CUTTACK. Speakers in the seminar said that the National Education Policy 2020 has changed the face of the Bharatiya Education System. The National Policy on Education has recommended school-based assessment for the assessment of learners. The success of NEP lies in its speedy implementation. Pro. Dr. P.C. Many women are earning their living by creating self-employment. Many students have educated themselves by coming to Sanskar Kendra and have also been able to get employment. Today the sense of affinity towards the school has increased in the society and people call this school as their school. Manas Path is organized from time to time by Kirtan Mandali. In order to promote social harmony through the school, the work of tying Raksha Sutra in Raksha Bandhan and Khichdi Bhoj by the children in the villages is done by the hostel brothers. Today, the sanskar kendras have a distinct identity of their own in this area. After the Corona period, the planning of the Sanskar Kendra has started running again in the area, it is a pleasant opportunity.

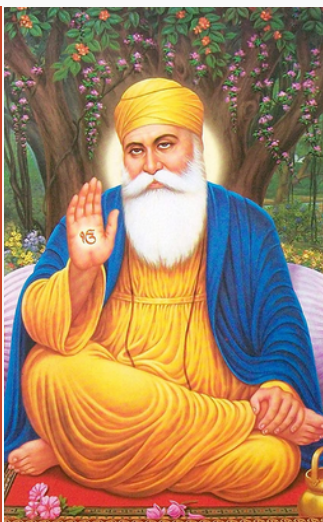
